After you read this form, you can:

Take your time to think about the information that has been provided to you. Have a friend or family member read the form. Talk it over with your doctor. It's up to you. If you choose to be in the study, then you can sign the form. If you do not want to take part in this study, you do not sign the form. Only those patients who sign the informed consent and research authorization form can take part in this study.
