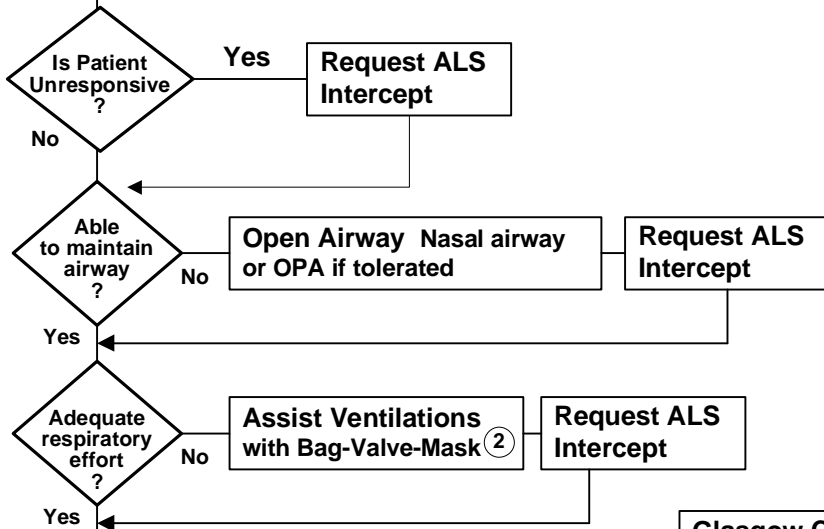

- Establish time of onset of stroke



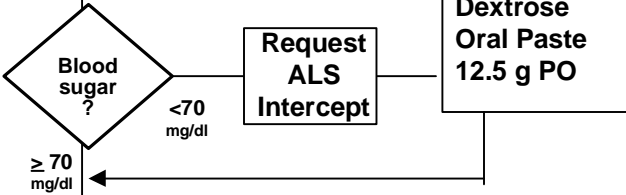

Best Verbal Response	Oriented	5
	Confused	4
	Inappropriate words	3
	Incomprehensible words	2
	None	1
Best Motor Response	Obeys Commands	6
	Localizes Pain	5
	Withdraws (Pain)	4
	Flexion	3
	Extension	2
	None	1

Monitor SaO2
Frequent Vital Signs

If Specialist IV NS
TKO with 18 gauge catheter ^③



Raise head of bed 45 if possible
Prepare to suction airway as needed

- The Cincinnati Prehospital Stroke Scale**
- Facial Droop** (have patient show teeth or smile)
- Normal--both sides of face move equally
 - Abnormal--one side does not move as well as the other
- Arm Drift** (patient closes eyes and holds arms out):
- Normal--both arms move the same OR both arms do not move at all
 - Abnormal--one arm does not move OR one arm drifts down
- Speech** (have the patient say "You can't teach old dogs new tricks"):
- Normal--patient uses correct words with no slurring
 - Abnormal--patient slurs words, uses inappropriate words, or is unable to speak
