TRAUMA-Pelvic and Extremities

BLS Protocol

ABC's
100% Oxygen
 Evaluate airway while maintaining c-spine stabilization and complete General Trauma evaluation

- Document:**
- ABCs
 - Detailed Assessment
 - Vital Signs
 - SpO2
 - Glasgow Coma Scale
 - Motor Function
 - Neurologic Deficits
 - Lung Sounds
 - Skin Color
 - Treatment
 - Response to Treatment
 - Communication with Medical Control

Control Bleeding

Control major bleeding immediately. Expose skin to evaluate for injury. Request LALS/ALS intercept immediately. Advise Medical Control of patient status.

Clinical Signs of Shock?

Consider the use of MAST for suspected pelvic fracture. Request LALS/ALS intercept.

Immobile and position patient appropriately

Confirm neurological signs before and after immobilization

Splint fractures as necessary, confirming pulses, motion, sensation before & after splinting. If necessary, see Amputated Parts or Bleeding protocols (*Part 1, Section 1*)

Contact Medical Control for direction on patient destination and definitive treatment

Re-evaluate vitals and ABC's frequently, request LALS or ALS intercept early if not auto-ALS.
